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## AETS Seven Sacred Teachings Award

### Eligibility

A nominee can be a youth aged 15-29 years as a single recipient or a group of youth that meet specific eligibility criteria. *Political work is not eligible.*

Under extenuating circumstances, AETS and AETS Elder in Residence may consider issuing a certificate of acknowledgement for a youth in their respective community under the age of 15 who demonstrates one or a combination of the Seven Sacred Teachings.

### **Nominated recipients or youth groups must:**

- be a citizen or affiliate of one of the nine AETS communities:  
**First Nations:** Animbiigoo Zaagi'igan Anishinabek (Lake Nipigon Ojibway), Biinjitiwaabik Zaaging Anishinabek (Rocky Bay First Nation), Biitigong Nishnaabeg (Ojibways of the Pic River First Nation), Bingwi Neyaashi Anishinabek (Sandpoint First Nation), Kiashke Zaaging Anishinabek (Gull Bay First Nation), Michipicoten First Nation, Pays Plat First Nation, Pic Mobert First Nation, and Red Rock Indian Band.
- be 15- 29 years of age
- have contributed to addressing the health, social and/or economic challenges, improving the quality of life or well-being of others
- have demonstrated at least one of the Seven Sacred Teachings in whole or in part (Love, Honesty, Truth, Courage, Wisdom, Humility and/or Respect) in any combination through their actions as a condition of the nomination.

## **Assessment process**

The Seven Sacred Teachings Awards are administered through a call for nominations and an assessment process:

- AETS & AETS Elders in Residence for each community are provided a copy of the nomination(s) received for their community to review and select a community recipient or youth group. This process ensures that nominee(s) are eligible for consideration.

## **Assessment criteria**

Nominees are assessed according to clear evidence that the nominee has excelled in demonstrating at least one or more of the Seven Sacred Teachings, and that their actions have contributed to either of the following:

- addressing health, social and/or economic challenges, and/or improving the quality of life or well-being of others.
- Volunteerism, group events, etc.

## **The nomination will outline the:**

Nominee(s) contribution to others, the specific activity, the impact, the challenge(s) faced and how the nominee is an inspiration to others. The selection process will include AETS and AETS Elder in Residence.
