Resource Development Advisor Update

As you are most likely aware, the Ontario Power Generation Corp. (OPG) is proposing to develop two “power generating stations” on the “Little Jackfish River” located on the northeast shores of Lake Nipigon. As a result, our community, Bingwi Neyaashi has signed an agreement with OPG to be actively engaged to participate in a three year Environmental Assessments study within the proposed site.

As part of the overall process, a number of benefits will accompany the project. In order for us to successfully capitalize on these opportunities we will need members to complete a skills inventory. I strongly encourage Band members to fill out a “skills inventory” form, with this, our people will be given every opportunity to further their education, to prosper and to live a good healthy life through education and training which will lead to meaningful long-term employment. To date, Bingwi Neyaashi has sent out over 220 forms receiving 34 in return.

We are currently developing a 10 year education work plan with Confederation College and negotiating with various funding agencies that could be available for the next decade. All levels of education will be available to our membership; starting with GED/ACE, post secondary courses. For students that qualify, they could roll right into an apprenticeship program of their choice.
